Day 1 – Sep 6, 2025 – Split

Welcome to Split!

The story of Split is already 17 centuries old, dating to the time the Roman Emperor Diocletian decided to build his Palace right on the peninsula near the great Roman city Salona, where he wanted to spend the last years of his life. During these 1700 years the Palace slowly turned into a city, which to this day lures with its rich tradition, glorious history and beauty of its natural and cultural heritage.

There's no doubt Diocletian's Palace is the top must-see attraction in Croatia's second biggest city – Split. This UNESCO protected World Heritage Site is actually the heart of the whole city – almost two thousand years old, the enormous palace exists today as a "living monument" – meaning it's dotted with quaint shops, galleries, cafes, restaurants and people actually live and work within its old walls. And that's what makes it really special – it's an ancient Roman palace absolutely integrated into the everyday life and doings of Split and its people.

If today is your arrival day - upon arrival at the airport, you will be greeted by our representative – private Eng.-speaking driver and they will get you settled, and you'll be on your way to Split port. Meet the rest of the group while enjoying a welcome drink! At 2 pm we'll be boarding the luxury mini cruise that will be our home for the next 8 days. After settling in, welcome meet & greet cocktail reception on board and your cruise manager will introduce you to the entire crew.

Meet with our private licensed local guide and enjoy the Split historical tour.

The tour includes the general history of Split and the development of the city from the 3rd century. You'll visit all the important sights that are both stunning and have a historic and cultural significance for the development of the city and the Community. The tour includes the visit to the 1700-year-old Roman Palace. It is the home of most of the city sights like the Basements, beautiful Roman squares and statues, The Bell Tower and Jupiter's temple. Throughout the Palace there are plenty of details that could keep you occupied for hours. Within few minutes walking distance of the Palace there are a few Renaissance squares, the City Promenade and some interesting markets. The second-largest city in Croatia, Split (Spalato in Italian) is a great place to see Dalmatian life as it's really lived.

Learn everything about major historical sites & culture and wrap up the day with a wonderful **Welcome Dinner** with your fellow travelers and hosts in one of the best restaurants in town! Always buzzing, this exuberant city has just the right balance of tradition and modernity. Step inside Diocletian's Palace and you'll see dozens of bars, restaurants & shops thriving amid the atmospheric old walls where Split life has been going on for thousands of years.

Day 2 – Sep 7, 2025 – Split – Brač Island (Pučišća – Škrip – Bol)



Breakfast | Lunch on board | 'From Farm to Table' Experience (food&wine incl) | Wine Tasting

Breakfast on board! This morning we sail towards the island of Brač! On our way to Brač we'll enjoy a swim stop and lunch on board. Brač may be one of many when it comes to islands off the Croatian coast, but this Dalmatian island is unmatched when it comes to natural beauty and must-visit attractions. Beaches of fine white pebbles ribbon its coastline, and cycling paths and hiking trails crisscross the island, passing through age-old villages, lush olive groves, and neat rows of vineyards. Dotting the coast are charming fishing villages offering a taste of the local way of life that carries on once the last tourists have gone.

It is the largest island in Dalmatia famous for its beautiful beaches and limestone. The White House in Washington, D.C, the Hofburg in Vienna and the Diocletian Palace in Split are all built with this special stone! Once we reach the port of Pučišća, we'll **visit the Stonemasonry school**, followed by a short drive to the oldest village on island of Brač – Škrip. The island is also famous for its **olive oil** that you'll have a chance to taste together with some other local specialties.

We'll finish the tour in picturesque town of Bol, **enjoying wine tasting in most famous winery on the island located at the seafont**. Stina's wines offer a true expression of indigenous grapes and of Dalmatia as a whole. Powerful reds with the well-known characteristics of sour cherries and Mediterranean herbs, along with beautifully crisp whites, with a strong structure, extreme minerality and saline notes - a true taste of the Adriatic! Full of uniqueness and beauty, the island of Brač is above all an island of contrasts - at the same time scarce and rich, separate and connected, humble and defiant. And whoever met him at some point will always testify to the same thing: his country is stingy, but the spirit of the people is extremely rich!

Day 3 – Sep 8, 2025 – Brač Island – Stari Grad (Hvar Island)



Breakfast | Lunch on board | Wine Tasting in two local wineries | Captain's Dinner

Dobro jutro! Breakfast on board before sailing towards Stari Grad, we'll enjoy a swim stop along the way. **Stari Grad (Pharos)** is the oldest town in Croatia. The same year - 384 b.c. when the Greek philosopher Aristotle was born in Trakia, the Greeks from the island of Paros in the Aegean Sea settled the town on the island of Hvar and named it Pharos.

Stari Grad (eng. "old town") is the historical heart of the island of Hvar. The town is situated in a landscape where the blue of the deep bay touches the green of the widely famous field of Pharos, with vineyards and olive groves. The fields used to provide sustenance and the bay provided protection. Today, both the fields and the bay add an attractive quality to the island, in which the modern vacation sights have become intertwined with the town's and island's antiquities.

Morning is for relaxing like locals, swimming, sunbathing, coffee or cocktail, port talks on cruise, while afternoon is reserved for visit to Vrbovska and Jelsa making stop at two **wine makers** - two small coastal towns which has a very proud and long wine-making tradition. You will have a chance to taste what it's like to try "2718 hours in the bottle". Young and ambitious "wine newcomers" without vineyards or with very small land plots. Their feeling belief is that basing wine production on grapes purchased from other farmers can't possibly be as good as coming from your own vineyard. Here in Croatia, Dubokovic wines

have become a "must have" in the finest restaurants, hotels and specialized wine shops. Dubokovic – Medvid wines now have the distinction of being the most expensive regular vintage wines in the country. Evening is wrapped up for **Captain's dinner** – combination of good food, interesting company, fascinating stories and good music!

Overnight Stari Grad.

Day 4 – Sep 9, 2025 – Stari Grad – Hvar Town



Breakfast | Lunch on board | Traditional Dinner incl Wine

Breakfast on board while we set sail to town of Hvar on island Hvar. After lunch, disembarking and meeting with our **local guide for a private walking tour!** Hvar is one of the most sought-after destinations, attracting the rich and famous, something that's obvious when you see its harbor in the summer, filled with mega yachts. Everyone comes for its beautiful beaches as well as its world-class dining and nightlife scene, but this sunny island has, even more, to offer for travelers of all types. Hvar Town has a historic center with impressive landmarks like Španjola Fortress which offers a panoramic view over the town, harbor, the sea, and nearby islands from the top. It's also home to the oldest still active public theater in Europe, which dates back over 400 years.

After the Hvar town walking tour, we'll explore the inland of island of Hvar. We'll drive through the green and rural island of Hvar, passing through Brusje. The old road is paved with amazing views. We will stop at Napoleon Road and have the perfect views of the island's deepest bays. Then we approach the fascinating village of Velo Grablje founded in the 14th century. Stone houses and courtyards still capture your attention with their fascinating architecture, while walking within its narrow streets you will feel the breath of past times. Today the village is nearly abandoned having but a few permanent villagers, although it was a rich and prosperous place, famous for its good wine and olive oil production. Honey production was well known as well, together with lavender oil being the leading one in Europe of the time. As we had back and leaving Velo Grablje along the dry brook line, we will get to the charming, **abandoned village of Malo Grablje**. Our **authentic Dalmatian dinner** (wine incl) will be in one of the villages.

Late evening for leisure. Overnight in Hvar Island.

Day 5 – Sep 10, 2025 – Hvar Island – Korčula Island



Breakfast | Lunch | Olive Oil Tasting | Local Tavern Dinner

Breakfast on board and sailing towards the island of Korčula - it is one of the greenest islands in the Adriatic Sea, with abundant vineyards and olive groves. The dense woods led the original Greek settlers to call the island Korkyra Melaina (Black Korčula). Quiet coves and small sandy beaches dot the steep southern coast while the northern shore is flatter and more pebbly.

The main city of the island Korčula has the same name. Ringed by imposing defenses, this coastal citadel is dripping in history, with marble streets rich in Renaissance and Gothic architecture. Our **private local guide** will take you on a unique tour of the old town of Korčula. You will hear many interesting stories and legends about the city and the life of Marco Polo, the most famous son of Korčula. It is still the most famous as the birthplace of Marco Polo who was probably born here in 1254, and reminders of him can be seen all around the town, including the extremely interesting Marco Polo Museum which is something you definitely don't want to miss when visiting this beautiful Dalmatian town. Today it's a town where you can vividly feel the Mediterranean spirit of people who live and work in this mixture of Gothic, Renaissance, and Baroque architecture.

We continue to **explore inland of Korčula island** - If you love olive oil, then there is no better place to be than the island of Korčula. Oil mill Zlokić was founded in 1995 in Velika Luka. The Zlokić family, in particular, is known for being one of the leading olive oil producers on the island. The family's collection boasts many old-fashioned tools for olive oil making, including a 15th-century wooden olive press and an 18th-century hydraulic compression system. The family's oil mill is 700 square meters and is located in Vela Luka. Just before the lunch we'll do a 5 S's (SEE, SWIRL, SNIFF, SIP, SAVOR) at **local winery in Smokvica**. You'll get a chance to taste famous POŠIP – a grape variety unique to Korčula.

We'll have lunch in amazing **Local Taverna** where authentic cuisine full of flavor has been served to guests for over two decades. Homemade food, including bread, the highly recommended pasta served with various sauces, goats' cheese, olive oil, home-grown vegetables, and the traditional and more personalized desserts. Just recently they have received a green Michelin star that serves as a recognition of the inspiring commitment in favor of sustainability and more responsible gastronomy.

Free evening in Korčula town. If you are looking for a great & unique shopping store – Korčula is the right places, plenty of small boutique local shops and jewelry stores. Overnight in Korčula

Day 6 – Sep 11, 2025 – Korčula Island – Pelješac peninsula (Ston – Slano)



Breakfast | Light lunch Oyster&mussels & Wine Tasting | Dinner on board

Early in the morning, while breakfast is served, we set sail for Pelješac peninsula Trstenik. **Pelješac** is a peninsula in southern Croatia, in the Dubrovnik-Neretva County. It is around 70 km long and is connected with Croatian Mainland at Ston. The Pelješac Channel divides the peninsula from the island of Korčula. Scattered like breadcrumbs across the foothills of the dolomites, the hamlets, and villages of southern Pelješac evoke an ancient past. The rocks, the vegetation, the groves of pine and cypress - everywhere a sense of timelessness prevails. On the hills above the sea, abandoned villas and gardens, stone walls and columns lie crumbling in the sun. Lemon, fig and almond trees, herbs and wildflowers surround the villages gardens and fields. On our way we will stop for a swim in one of the many picturesque bays dotting the coast. Upon arrival in Trstenik, we will embark on **our gastronomic adventure!**

Our first stop is one of the most famous wineries - **Grgich Winery** - Famed for his Grgich Hills in Napa, he resorted back to his Pelješac roots in the late 1990's, opening his Croatian cellar. Here, taste the wines created by the man who sensed a familial relationship between Plavac Mali and Zinfandel, which led to discovery of their common origin from Crljenak Kaštelanski grapes! After a few glasses of wine and head to meet oysterman, taking a short **boat ride to the oyster farm** in the middle of the bay enjoying a **traditional lunch with a glass of wine in hand** - we'll be tasting this natural aphrodisiac straight from the sea. Talk about a gourmet's dream!

Before we head back to our boat, we'll visit Ston city - the town with the longest stone wall in Europe (5,5 km) and the other in the world after the Chinese Wall! The walls were reinforced with 40 towers and 5 fortresses. Originally, they were 7 km long but were partially destroyed in the 1667 earthquake. After the Dubrovnik Republic acquired the Pelješac peninsula in 1334, it required the protection of the town of Ston and started building the defense walls. This large complex was built in Dubrovnik from 1334 to 1506. At that time, it was the largest fortification-urbanist project in Europe. We return to our ship in the late afternoon and spend the night in Slano, **dinner on board**.

Overnight in Slano.

Day 7 – Sep 12, 2025 – Pelješac peninsula – Dubrovnik



Breakfast | Lunch | Farewell Dinner

Breakfast on board and sailing towards Dubrovnik. We'll enjoy our last swim stop if possible, at the **island of Koločep** – called by locals 'Kalamota' belongs to Elafiti Archipelago, the group of Dubrovnik's islands. The nearest to Dubrovnik, the island is located just 5 km away from Gruz, the Dubrovnik's main ferry port. This is also the smallest of the three inhabited islands in the archipelago with an area of just 2.6 sq km (1.1 sq miles) and just under 160 permanent inhabitants. Two small villages, Gornje Čelo on the southeast side and Donje Čelo on the north side of the island are the only settlements. The Elaphiti Islands or the Elaphites is a small archipelago consisting of several islands stretching northwest of Dubrovnik, in the Adriatic Sea. The Elaphites have a total land area of around 30 square kilometers and a population of 850 inhabitants.

Lunch served on board. **The last stop on our trip is Dubrovnik**, a city that will welcome you with open arms, as it does for visitors from all parts of the world. Surrounded by its fabled medieval walls, Dubrovnik is widely known as the "Pearl of the Adriatic". It is a medieval city on the Croatian side of the Adriatic coastline and treasure trove of cultural, historical monuments that were created throughout its thousand-year existence. In the past, it was a City-Republic, and alongside Venice one of the most famous cultural-economic centers on the Mediterranean. In more recent times, it has become the center of modern cultural and tourist events: a city of summer festivals – an international parade of top musical and theatrical achievements, a city of museums and galleries. These values have turned Dubrovnik into a place that offers a rich selection of various experiences and excitement, but also a complete holiday in a quiet and calming, mild Mediterranean ambience and wonderful seaside landscapes.

Upon arrival we will go on a **private sightseeing tour of the UNESCO-protected Old town**, acquainting you with its most important monuments and hidden spots. After the walking tour you'll get to enjoy time at leisure to explore this beautiful city further on your own. We'll wrap up the journey with **Farewell Dinner** in one of the best restaurants in Dubrovnik.

Overnight in Dubrovnik.

Day 8 – Sep 13, 2025 – Dubrovnik

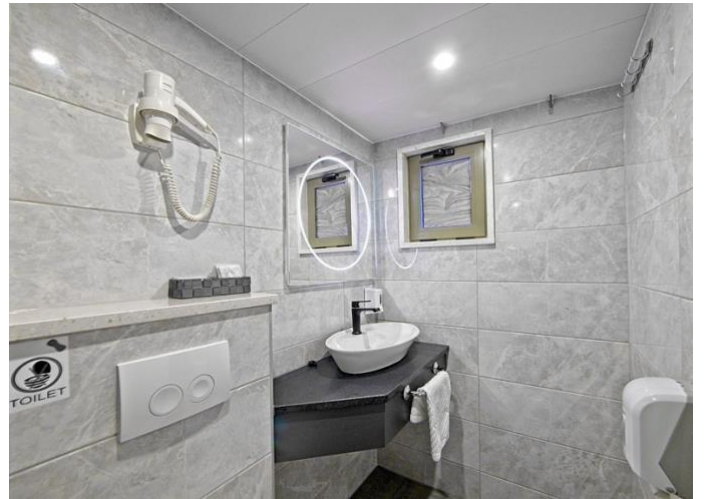

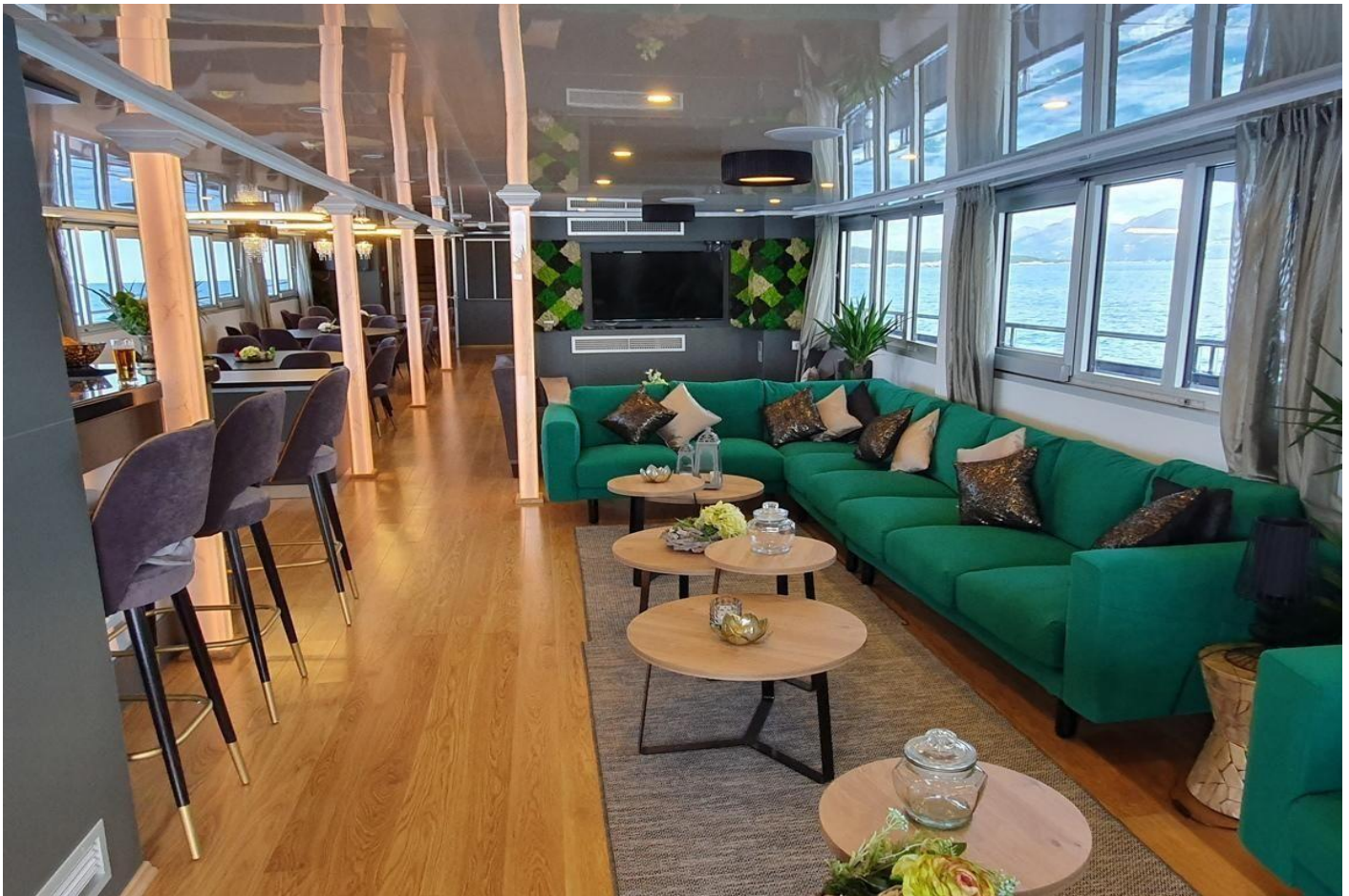

Cancellations of confirmed bookings 120 days or more prior to departure will receive full refund minus 30% of the program price and any non-refundable paid fees (e.g., non-refundable airfare, cruise or hotel deposits). 120 up to 100 days will be subject to loss of 50% of program price. 99 days or less will be subject to loss of 100% of program price.

Tour quotes do not include airfare to/from the trip start point unless noted on the itinerary.

Cost increases in currency exchange, government fees, taxes, surcharges, or hotel/lodge tariff increases between quote date and start date are payable by the client.

Availability cannot be guaranteed until booked. Any holds we have placed on your behalf are temporary, hotels and services listed are not guaranteed, prices subject to change. We recommend booking early and quickly.

We accept payment via credit card or wire transfer. Program package quotes do not include airfare to/from the trip start point unless specifically noted on the itinerary.
